Arc Flash Safety Training



Under the NFPA 70E standard, arc flash training not only needs to be completed every three years, but it must also be documented and employees must be able to demonstrate that they understand how to safely work on electrical equipment.

Our Arc Flash Safety Training is a custom, eight-hour course for qualified employees who face a risk of electric shock, and non-qualified employees who are involved with or responsible for recognizing and mitigating risks in the workplace. By incorporating both the NFPA regulation and your company-specific arc flash requirements, this training gives participating employees the knowledge to safely perform their maintenance and everyday workplace activities around energized electrical equipment.

Process

- Before coming on-site, our engineer takes your company-specific arc flash information and creates your custom training materials
- While on-site, we provide an interactive training session that provides thorough knowledge of the dangers of working near, or on, energized electrical equipment
- Following the training, attendees receive a workbook, a certificate of completion and are able to recognize and understand the safety precautions required when working around or with energized equipment

- OSHA regulations, responsibilities, training and PPE (personal protective equipment)
- NFPA updates and compliance
- NFPA PPE tables
- What is an arc flash and related information, such as safe work practices, assessment, boundaries, labeling, work permits and PPE requirements

Arc Flash Awareness Training

The two-hour Arc Flash Awareness Training is for non-qualified employees that aren't directly interacting with electrical equipment, but need to understand the recognized electrical hazards of the equipment they operate or work near on a daily basis.

Train-the-Trainer

This two-day course is available for those who want to sustain the arc flash training component of their safety program in house. In this training we take you through the full-day training and how to present it, then turn the curriculum over to you. This is ideal for those who are responsible for overseeing their electrical safety program and tasked with recognizing and mitigating hazards in the workplace through administrative controls, engineering practices and safe work practices.
